Cottleville/Weldon Spring Rotary Completes Flood Relief Project

CWS Rotarians have just completed a flood relief project providing over \$3000 of supplies to families in St. Charles County impacted by the spring floods. Mops, brooms, squeegees, Kilz, and cleaning supplies were among the items donated by Rotarians and community members. CWS Rotary partnered with the City of Cottleville to purchase items, receive donations, and deliver supplies to several locations in St. Charles County for distribution to flood victims.

Membership notes

The following is a worksheet for the 'Ignite' plan initiated by District 5240 to increase and recognize Membership Engagement. This is one of the many initiatives across RI to encourage membership and engagement. For more information regarding 'Ignite' please contact our District Membership Chair, Michael Dineen.

Rotary District 5240 Ignite Membership Citation

The Purpose:

- To ignite every ROTARIAN by involving them in one or more of the following activities to obtain points.

Rationale:

- Everyone has something to contribute toward the success of their Club; therefore, every person has the power to make a difference.

How to Become a Premier Club and Receive the Governor's Membership Citation:

- Multiply the number of Club members by 10 (for example, 50 members x 10 = 500 points.) This will be the Club minimum number of points needed to become a Premier Club.

How to Obtain Points?

- Bring in a new member 25 pts. for each new member

- New member brings in a New Member (Bonus in addition to #1) 20 pts. For each new member
- Establish a Club Membership Goal 20 pts. (One Time)
- Develop a Membership Committee of 4 or more 15 pts. (One time)
- Select and complete 4 or more of the “15 + Tips for Successful Clubs” 10 pts. for each tip completed
- Assign a Mentor to each New Member 10 pts. for each Mentor
- Give Committee Assignment to New Member in First Week 10 pts. One time per new member
- Hold Training for New Members 10 pts. for each Fireside
- New Member Participates in Service Project 10 pts. One time per new member
- Potential Member gets involved in Service Project 10 pts. (One time)
- Invite a District Membership Committee Member to be a Speaker at your Club 10 pts. for each speaker
- Develop an Attractive Website 10 pts. (One time)
- Hold a Club Assembly focused on Membership 5 pts. each attendee (One Time)
- Bring a Visitor to a Club Meeting 5 pts. one time for each visitor
- Propose a New Member 5 pts. for each proposed member
- Assign a Member to Keep Track of Points 5 pts. (One Time)
- Attend the District Membership Seminar 5 pts. for each attendee
- If EVERY MEMBER of your Club Participates in 1 or more of the above 50 pts.

NOTE: points can be assigned at the discretion of club leaders. Individual Points are obvious (the member that brings in a new member get 25 points). Other areas the points can be assigned to the person doing the work. For example, the meeting organizer for firesides, the assigned mentor, etc.

Club Recognition:

- District Award to best Club on percentage basis will be presented at the District Conference or other appropriate time.
- Every Premier Club will receive the Ignite Emblem to sew on their club banner
